James Hodgkinson, from the Macquarie Group Foundation, initiated the 20/twenty Challenge in 2004. His nephew Alex, who has cerebral palsy, inspired James to launch the fundraising challenge.

James experienced first-hand how access to equipment positively affected Alex's emotional and social wellbeing. He knew that this equipment was often very expensive. He saw the 20/twenty Challenge as an opportunity to help other families access the essential equipment their children needed so they could lead as independent a life as possible.

In the past 6 years, over 500 supporters have participated in the 20/twenty Challenge, raising a total of \$2.1 million. The funds have been used to purchase more than 800 items of communication and mobility equipment for children with cerebral palsy.
